What type of license do you need?

VS

Counseling Facility

Per <u>A.A.C. R9-10-101(60)</u>, "**counseling facility**" means a health care institution that only provides counseling, which may include:

- DUI screening, education, or treatment according to the requirements in <u>9 A.A.C. 20, Article 1</u>; or
- Misdemeanor domestic violence offender treatment according to the requirements in <u>9 A.A.C. 20, Article 2</u>

Per <u>A.A.C. R9-10-101(59)</u>, "**counseling**" has the same meaning as "practice of professional counseling" in <u>A.R.S. § 32-3251</u>, which means the professional application of mental health, psychological and human development theories, principles and techniques to:

- Facilitate human development and adjustment throughout the human life span
- Assess and facilitate career development
- Treat interpersonal relationship issues and nervous, mental and emotional disorders that are cognitive, affective or behavioral
- Manage symptoms of mental illness
- Assess, appraise, evaluate, diagnose and treat individuals, couples, families and groups through the use of psychotherapy

Allowable services:

- Counseling
- DUI screening
- DUI education
- DUI treatment
- Misdemeanor domestic violence offender treatment

Note: Services other than the allowable services listed above are prohibited (i.e. ancillary services, health-related services, medication services, nursing services, medical services, etc.).

Staff requirements:

- Counseling is provided under the direction of a behavioral health professional (BHP)
- Counseling is provided by a BHP or behavioral health technician (BHT)
- Personnel member who provides counseling is at least 18 yrs. old
- If counseling is provided to patients under the age of 18, an employee or a volunteer and the owner comply with the fingerprint clearance card requirements in <u>A.R.S. § 36-425.03</u>

Outpatient Treatment Center

Per <u>A.A.C. R9-10-101(158)</u>, "outpatient treatment center" means a class of health care institution without inpatient beds that provides physical health services or behavioral health services for the diagnosis and treatment of patients

Allowable services:

- Behavioral health services and, if applicable:
 - Behavioral health observation/stabilization services
 - Children's behavioral health services
 - Court-ordered evaluation
 - Court-ordered treatment
 - Counseling
 - Crisis services
 - Opioid treatment services
 - Pre-petition screening
 - Respite services
 - Respite services for children on the premises
 - DUI education
 - DUI screening
 - DUI treatment, or
 - Misdemeanor domestic violence offender treatment
- Diagnostic imaging services
- Clinical laboratory services
- Dialysis services
- Emergency room services
- Pain management services
- Physical health services
- Rehabilitation services
- Sleep disorder services
- Urgent care services provided in a freestanding urgent care center setting
- Medication services
- Ancillary services (i.e. case management, peer support, etc.)
- Medical services
- Nursing services
- Health-related services

Note: Services that require overnight stays or inpatient stays are prohibited.

Staff requirements:

- Physical health services are provided under the direction of a physician and registered nurse practitioner
- Behavioral health services performed by or under the supervision of professional who is licensed pursuant to Title 32 and whose scope of practice allows the professional to provide these services
